

# PERTH'S HIGH ACHIEVERS

The Rotaract Club of Perth, WA, has been busy this past Rotary year fundraising and getting hands-on to help those in need, both close to home and abroad.

## **Masquerade Ball**

The Rotaract Club of Perth raised over \$12,600 for the Perth Homeless Support Group through organising a Masquerade Ball. In total, 189 people attended, enjoying dancing to the fabulous Rotars band (musical talent from the Rotary Club of Perth), getting their snaps taken at the photo booth and bidding on the silent auction.

The Eye Contact exhibit, featuring portraits of Perth's homeless snapped by photographer Phil England, was also open for exploration. Additionally, Nicolaus, a man who had previously been homeless and had been helped off the street by the Perth Homeless Support Group, shared his moving story, giving a first-hand perspective of what it is like to be without somewhere to call home.

## **Street Art and Eats Tour**

## **Kimberley Dental Project**

The Kimberley Dental Project provides

toothbrushes to rural and Indigenous communities in the North of Western Australia, who have limited access to dental care. The Rotaract Club of Perth assisted the Kimberley dental team by packaging over 20,000 toothbrushes into family packs, each containing a set of different coloured toothbrushes, so each family member could easily claim a toothbrush of their own. •
